

# Community Arts: Banners and Flags



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Banners & flags are fantastic way of creating colour and movement at an event. They tell a story in pictures and can be created by the community very easily. Storage is not an issue as they fold away and take up very little room.

Flags can be used to delineate a space, create an entrance way or as something to catch the eye.

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## Banner & flag creation projects:

- **Molong Stories 06** – Facilitated the creation of flags that told stories of the local community groups and colourful individuals that live in and around Molong, NSW. Paraded during Molong Music and Arts Festival
- **Kids at Heart 08** – A childrens festival held in Dubbo, NSW. Worked with outlying childrens groups to create their own colourful flags. Displayed and paraded at the Festival
- **Flags by the Meander 09/10** – Project creator and Facilitator: Flags made by schools around Tasmania and in Alice Springs were displayed at the Tasmanian Craft Fair, Deloraine; largest craft fair in the Southern Hemisphere.
- **Flyfish 2012** - Banners created by local schools that were paraded by the countries involved in the Commonwealth Flyfishing Championships. These flags reflected the countries participating and were given to the representatives of those countries to take back with them.
- **Banners on the Bridge 14** – Project developer and facilitator. A project for the Tasmanian Craft Fair to involve local community groups in creating banners that reflected their community group. Used to fly on the bridge across the Meander River in Deloraine to create an entrance spectacle during the Tasmanian Craft Fair.
